#### President's Message

As we leave those wonderful March activities behind Harness races, Flat Track races, Steeplechase, and USCA Polo events, we are enjoying the wonders of April, the Masters and of course, Easter, as our very successful winter semester draws to a close.

We have achieved a very high level of activity. We have registered over 380 members with an approximated total of 1960 instruction seats this semester. The leading course was Lewis and Clark Corps of Discovery from Sacagawea's Perspective taught by Tiajuana King Cochnauer. There were 80 registered students in two sections. A close second was Aiken Women of the Winter Colony by Linda Johnson. There were 68 registered students.

As we look forward to the fall semester, it will look differently as the majority of our classes will be held in room 144 of the B&E building or the Tech Center for the technology courses. Room 144 is expected to hold about 40 students. For those courses that we expect to exceed 40 people (historically 25% of our courses) we will "rent larger rooms" or perhaps have two sections of a course as we have done a few times this year. The General Interest and the Technology Committees are diligently working to make the schedule manageable. I firmly believe that this will make the schedule easier to execute. We are very fortunate to have the continuing support of USCA and the Continuing Education staff.

I want to note the passing of Ralph Dale, who for 20 years has been the technical head of our SeniorNet, McGrath Computer Learning Center and this year, the Tech Center for CLL, as well as our Windows expert and instructor. Additionally, he was my close friend. He will be sorely missed. May he Rest in Peace.

We are looking forward to the Kauffman Luncheon on April 21 where we will acknowledge the work of the founder of the Academy Dr. Earl Kauffman and recognize the Volunteer of the Year. The featured Speaker will be the USCA Chancellor Dr Daniel Heimmermann providing his vision for USCA.

The organizational planning for next year is under-

#### February 11, 2022 Board Meeting

- The meeting was called to order at 2:00 pm by President Wayne Rickman.
- The minutes of the 1/14/22 Board meeting were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Michael circulated report. Some figures are incomplete as expenses have not been taken out and Book Fair costs and revenues need to be included. There were several questions about how the endowments are reported. Liz noted that they will be working on developing a clearer way of presenting the information.

- Course registration cutoff: one week for Technology; day before for General Interest

### General Interest Curriculum Committee: Steve Gordy Steve circulated notes from the 1/21 curriculum co

Steve circulated notes from the 1/21 curriculum committee meeting. He noted that he has drafted similar evaluation forms for use by both General Interest and Technology classes. He reported that an Ad Hoc Book Fair Committee has been created, with a tentative date of Sept. 24 for the Fair.

<u>Technology Interest Committee Chair:</u> Raleigh Daniel Raleigh noted that some technology classes will continue to transition to the B&E building, particularly those which are purely lecture and those with more than 12 people.

#### Publicity Committee Report: Jim Tisaranni

Jim distributed copies of a five-minute presentation which he, Harriet, Nancy and Doug developed. It is suitable for use as a standard promotional presentation about CLL.

Jim also handed out an update of the CLL Publicity Action Plan, Spring/Fall 2022, noting what has been accomplished and what remains to be done. Key questions include how many classroom seats are available at USCA? How much does CLL want to grow? How many USCA staff hours can be devoted to CLL?
